This summer **Poetry in the Park** returned once again to the Queen's Park bandshell. We were excited to celebrate the 12th Anniversary of **PIP**. Each session of our annual outdoor poetry event features two poets and a very popular Open Mic. Thanks to those who continued to support us by coming out to read and to listen, and to all the new faces who came out this year. Thanks so much to the City of New Westminster and the Arts New West for our 2023 funding. It was a huge success!

Our literary online magazine, **Wordplay at Work** gives RCLAS members an opportunity to submit their poems, short stories and other literary formats for publication. It continues to be wonderful showcase for both emerging and seasoned writers and a definitive perk to membership.

Annual highlights included the February Haiku Special Feature, contest issues and the National Poetry Month Co-operative Poem with contributions from 20+ RCLAS members."

Our free bi-monthly group **In Their Words** featured presenters sharing their favourite authors from any genre in poetry, fiction, non-fiction or drama, followed by Q&A. This year we had a wonderful eclectic mix with a broad spectrum of writers ranging from Edgar Allan Poe to Lucille Clifton, Emily Carr to Dorothy Wordsworth. Thank you to **In Their Words** manager and host **Ruth Kozak**. Excellent work!

Tellers of Short Tales, one of our free evening events, attracts storytellers from New Westminster and throughout the Lower

Mainland. ToST includes one feature writer as well as an Open Mic segment for short stories. Our 2023 Featured Authors included Winona Kent, Bill Arnott, Sylvia Taylor, Erik D'Souza, Cristy Watson, Esmeralda Cabral, Una Bruhns, and Jerena Tobiason. We also hosted a special edition in collaboration with Surrey International Writers Conference featuring Diana Gabaldon, Sonali Dev, and Renée Sarojini Saklikar.

Poetic Justice reading series showcasing the work of two featured poets each session followed by a popular open mic. Feature poets included: Cherie Hanson, W. Ruth Kozak, Paul Raworth Bennett, Kevin Spenst, Jónína Kirton, Ford Weisberg, Judith Berlin, Jessica Lee McMillan, Alan Hill, Aidan Chafe, Franci Louann, H.W. Bryce. We also included a few all Open-Mic zoom editions for fun.

In mid-January we launched our successful **11th Annual Write On! Contest**. Open to submissions of poetry, fiction and non-fiction with cash prizes in all three categories. The 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winning stories and poems as well as the honourable mentions were published in the RCLAS e-zine. We are thankful to the 2023 judges for taking up the challenge - all past winners from our previous year's contest. Thank you to Director **Angela Kenyon** for her fabulous admin work! We also invited the winners to read at Poetry in the Park this year.

Celebrating its tenth year, **the Annual Fred Cogswell Award for Excellence in Poetry** called on authors and publishers from across Canada for submissions of poetry books published in English in 2022. Our 2023 Judge is award-winning poet Joseph Dandurand. A longlist of ten books is announced mid-to-late November with the Top 3 to be announced in December. Cash prizes and award medals are sent to our First, Second and Third place award recipients.
